



Using Release® Adhesive & Sealant Remover and “The Stick” to Remove Protective Film

Many Recreational Vehicles (RVs) have a protective adhesive film that protects the exterior gel coat/clear coat finish. They can be tedious to remove without Release®.

Release® Adhesive & Sealant Remover breaks the bond of protective film adhesives. “The Stick” is a hand tool that is the perfect complement to Release®. Step-by-step instructions on how to remove protective film using these products follow.

Tools Required

“The Stick”		Stock #1813

Instructions

1. Starting in an upper corner, spray Release® on the edge of the film. Let the Release® begin to work and use “The Stick” to slowly and carefully peel a corner of the film. Once you have peeled up enough of the film to allow you to get a grip on it, spray again where the film meets the coach building a pocket, and slowly pull the film using a rocking motion. A side to side motion works best, first pulling one side and then the other, spraying as needed. If you pull too quickly, you can break the film and/or leave glue behind. Slow and steady is the key. 🐢
2. You will know when it is time for more Release® as the film will become harder to pull. Use “The Stick” as needed if the film breaks and you need to peel enough up to get a new grip on it.
3. If you find you are leaving glue behind, you are either not using enough Release® or you are trying to go too fast.
